**New Brunswick's "RBC Local Hockey Leader" awarded \$10,000 for hockey in his community**

**TORONTO, March 1, 2007** — Garry Brooks, the 'ice man', who donates both equipment and time to ensure that local kids have a chance to play hockey, will earn special recognition in the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto.

Brooks is this year's RBC Local Hockey Leader for New Brunswick, one of 13 volunteers (one for each Hockey Canada branch) recognized today by RBC Insurance, with support from Hockey Canada and the Hockey Hall of Fame. The winners, who will also receive a signed Team Canada jersey, were chosen from more than 1,000 nominations received from across the country.

"If there was no outdoor rink in Fredericton Junction, our kids would not play hockey, and if it wasn't for Garry Brooks we wouldn't have this ice," said Fredericton Junction's Valerie Webb in a nomination essay. "Garry is at the rink day and night, at all hours, flooding the ice and fixing anything that needs to be fixed. Residents will bring him hot turkey soup in the middle of the night when he is out flooding, because he is out there for the kids."

In addition to flooding the ice in all temperatures and weather conditions for Fredericton Junction's outdoor rural hockey program, Brooks has also donated hockey equipment, ice clearing equipment, and inspired dozens of local parents with his selfless volunteer spirit.

RBC Insurance will donate \$10,000 to the program in Brooks' name. Brooks is also invited to attend a special ceremony unveiling a display honouring the 2006-07 RBC Local Hockey Leaders at the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto. A banner recognizing his achievement will also be raised in the community.

"RBC Insurance is proud to recognize truly dedicated hockey volunteers like Garry Brooks," said Neil Skelding, President and CEO, RBC Insurance. "Hockey is a way of life in many Canadian communities, and this simply wouldn't happen without volunteers."

The RBC Local Hockey Leaders program is now in its fourth year. winners based on guidelines that include dedication, leadership, commitment and impact on hockey and hockey players in their community. To date, the program has donated more than \$450,000 to grassroots hockey initiatives across Canada.
