**Prince Edward Island's "RBC Local Hockey Leader" awarded \$10,000 for hockey
in his community**

TORONTO, March 1, 2007 — Terri MacDonald, a multi-tasking, local hockey volunteer, will earn special recognition in the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto.

MacDonald is this year's RBC Local Hockey Leader for Prince Edward Island, one of 13 volunteers (one for each Hockey Canada branch) recognized today by RBC Insurance, with support from Hockey Canada and the Hockey Hall of Fame. The winners, who will also receive a signed Team Canada jersey, were chosen from more than 1,000 nominations received from across the country.

As outlined in a nomination essay submitted by fellow Bedeque resident Heath Glover, MacDonald's volunteer commitment began 16 years ago. She started out doing fundraising to defray costs for minor hockey, and has been volunteering ever since. She has served as vice president, president, referee in chief, league coordinator, member of the PEI Minor Hockey Council and tournament organizer.

"Terri MacDonald is definitely the reason we have minor hockey and have a community arena," said Glover. "No one knows exactly how many hours she has logged as a volunteer, but the results are very visible."

RBC Insurance will donate \$10,000 to the program in MacDonald's name. MacDonald is also invited to attend a special ceremony unveiling a display honouring the 2006-07 RBC Local Hockey Leaders at the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto. A banner recognizing her achievement will also be raised in MacDonald's community.

"RBC Insurance is proud to recognize truly dedicated hockey volunteers like Terri MacDonald," said Neil Skelding, President and CEO, RBC Insurance. "Hockey is a way of life in many Canadian communities, and this simply wouldn't happen without volunteers."

The RBC Local Hockey Leaders program is now in its fourth year. A panel of experts including Hockey Hall of Fame Director of Public Affairs Ron Ellis, Chair of the Board for Hockey Canada René Marcil, and 2006 Olympic gold medalists Jennifer Botterill (Women's Ice Hockey) and Jean Labonté (Men's Sledge Hockey) selected the winners based on guidelines that include dedication, leadership, commitment and impact on hockey and hockey players in their community. To date, the program has donated more than \$450,000 to grassroots hockey initiatives across Canada.
